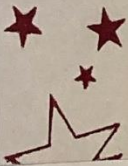
I agree, there aren't enough words to describe how many ways Susan touched people always smiling and positive in thoughts and deeds.

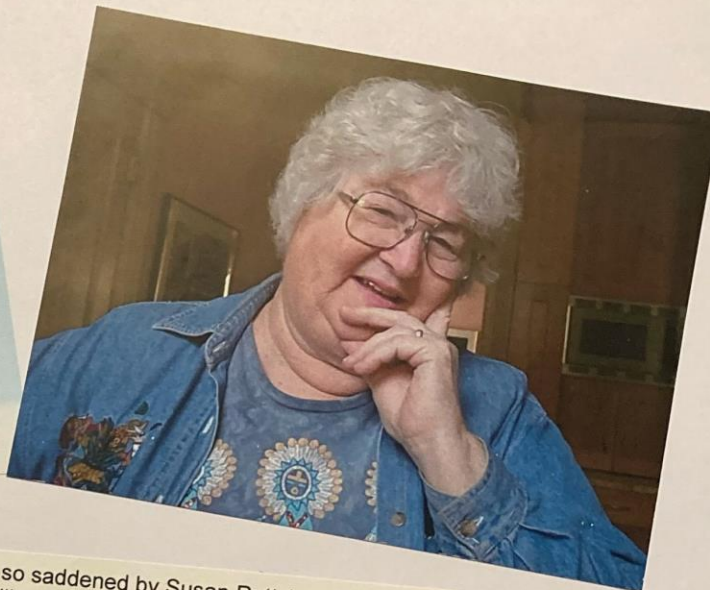
She will be in our hearts forever.

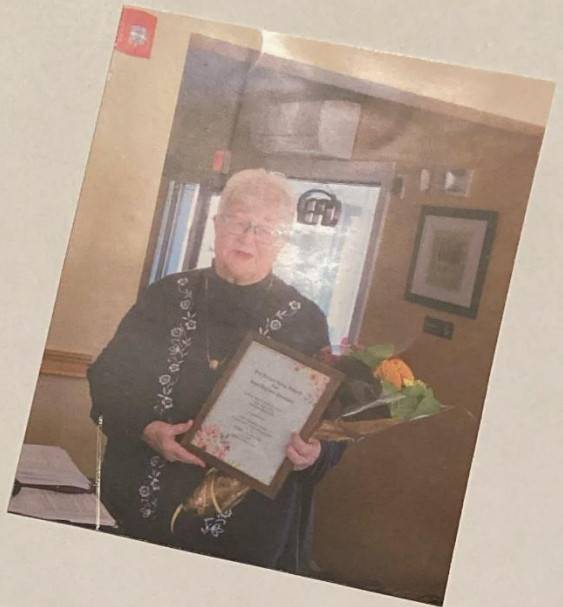
