WHAT'S NEW?

This year, we will offer **two (2)** Flower Design categories, each with its own set of unique Classes. The <u>first</u> is the Flower Arrangement Category with 5 design classes offered every year. The <u>second</u> is a **Miniature Category**, with 3 design classes.

Potted Houseplant classes have been reorganized – please review before preparing your entry for submission.

COMPETITION CATEGORIES and GUIDELINES

Artificial foliage and artificial flowers are not permitted. Accessories are acceptable and floral material may be used for Flower Design and Garden Bouquet Classes only. All entries are comprised of two subclasses: Adult (A) Juniors (J) ages 15 and younger.

Flower Design and Garden Bouquet Class entries need to present representation of the class, harmony, balance & proportion, condition, originality, and construction/container.

Fresh Flowers are judged on color, stem & foliage condition, uniformity, and size. Unless otherwise specified, only one specimen may be entered.

Potted Plants are judged on overall appearance. Freshness & healthy greenery, condition, form, and evidence of new growth will be reflected in your overall score. Plants must be disease, insect, and dust free or cannot be accepted as an entry.

Flower Arrangements

Class I Ruby Slippers

This one is easy—go gloriously red, in as many shapes and varieties as you like, to create a pleasing whole. You are always free to include other colors; the goal is a pleasing arrangement, not necessarily an all-red one.

Class II Over the Rainbow

Gather as many different-colored flowers as your garden offers and create a bright arrangement full of color. Your design should focus on colorful harmony; no need to create a rainbow shape.

Class III Wicked Witch of the West

Mirroring the witch herself, your design will include dark, moody almost-black flowers and foliage, together with strong green elements. There's nothing soft and sweet about the witch; she suggests angular shapes and sharp edges.

Class IV Horse of a Different Color

Look to the unusual for this class - flowers that are bicolored or striped, leaves that are variegated or unexpected colors like red, purple, or even blue. These are the flowers and foliage that will feature in your design (though not necessarily exclusively; you may include "ordinary" plants too).

Class V We're Not in Kansas Anymore

Sunflowers are the state flower of Kansas; they'll be a feature of your design.

Miniature Flower Arrangements

Your miniature entry, including the container and the tallest stems, should not be larger than 6 (six) inches in any direction.

Class M1 Welcome to Munchkinland!

A petite arrangement inspired by what Dorothy sees when she first opens the door after the cyclone drops the house in Oz.

Class M2 Glinda, Good Witch of the North

Frothy, feminine, with a lot of sparkle and pink. Have fun with this one.

Class M3 Emerald City

Create enchantment with a design of all green, or green with white or colored accents—it's up to you!

Garden Bouquets

<u>Best in Show Garden Bouquet</u> will receive \$15, sponsored by Haddam Garden Club and the Susan Rutty Award.

Class A Scarecrow

He's stuffed with wildflowers, meadow flowers, and grasses, and so is your bouquet. The Scarecrow is farmhouse casual personified, and your bouquet interpretation would be at home on a farmhouse kitchen table.

Class B Tin Man

You'll choose flowers, foliage, colors, and even just the right container to create an impression of the gentle Tin Man, yearning for a heart—or getting one at last! White, grey-green, and silvery elements will help evoke his unique appearance.

Class C Cowardly Lion

Big and bold, just as the Lion longs to be.
